

Theresa May to be ready to walk away from the European Union without a trade agreement, despite warnings from major manufacturers that a "no deal" Brexit would be an economic disaster.

In an open letter, 60 law-

bill it has already agreed to pay. The letter released on Sunday by Economists for Free Trade was signed by prominent supporters of a "hard Brexit," including ex-UK Treasury chief Nigel Lawson, Conservative law-

tions for 'no deal' and a move to a World Trade Deal under WTO rules." That would mean tariffs and other trade barriers between Britain and the EU, and many businesses say it would severely harm the UK economy.

Turkey held high-stakes presidential and parliamentary elections on Sunday that could consolidate President Recep Tayyip Erdogan's grip on power or curtail vast political ambitions. Opposition leaders called for ballots vowing to be held against voting fraud.

The elections will mark Turkey's transition to a new executive presidential system, a move announced in a controversial referendum last year.

Erdogan, 64, is set for a re-election for a five-year term with hugely increased powers under the new constitution, which he insists will bring prosperity and stability to Turkey, especially after a failed coup attempt that has left the country under a state of emergency. His ruling Justice and Development Party is expected to win, hoping to retain its majority in parliament.

Still, Erdogan—whom critics have been in power since 2002, facing a more robust opposition than in the past—has Opposition candidates vowed to return Turkey to a parliamentary democracy with strong checks and balances and have what they call Erdogan's "one-man rule."

"With these elections, Turkey is achieving a new democratic revolution," Erdogan told reporters after voting in Istanbul. His next term is set to begin in 2019.
